Influenza Vaccination for You and Your Loved One

It has been recognized for many years that people 65 years and older are at high risk of serious complications from influenza. During most seasons, it's estimated that 90 percent of seasonal influenza-related deaths and between 50 and 60 percent of seasonal influenza-related hospitalizations in the United States occur in people 65 years and older. Preventing influenza and treating it promptly may reduce the risk of influenza-associated complications, including hospitalization and death.



We can ALL help keep our loved ones healthy and safe by receiving the influenza vaccine ourselves. Influenza vaccine is available from your primary care provider or any local pharmacy in town!

How the Influenza vaccine works: Flu vaccines cause antibodies to develop in the body about two weeks after vaccination. These antibodies provide protection against infection with the viruses that are in the vaccine. The seasonal flu vaccine protects against the influenza viruses that research indicates will be most common during the upcoming season!

Greetings Residents and Families -

If you are wanting to make changes to any of your Medicare Plans for 2020, the Open Enrollment Dates are October 15, 2019 to December 17, 2019 (change effective January 1, 2020). See your BSJ Care Center Social Worker with questions or concerns regarding your Medicare A, B, C or D coverage.

For those who have Medical Assistance, you are required to renew your benefits annually. You will receive a renewal application in the mail from WREA (Western Region for Economic Assistance). Please complete this on time, as this effects your coverage for room and board and prescriptions. If it is not renewed by the due date, it may affect your payment source. Your BSJ Care Center Social Worker or Linda Handke, Business Administrative Assistant, is available to assist with this process.
