She continued to teach elementary grades for over 33 years in many rural schools, retiring from the Viroqua Area School District in 1984 at the age of 52. Caroline also loved to travel. At the age of 20 she made her first transatlantic trip on an ocean liner from New York City to England destined to meet her maternal relatives in Alsace France. Marvin and Caroline continued to be avid travelers They logged three trips to Norway and visited many other domestic and international locations on various tours and cruises.
