Marinuka Manor's Winter Menu now provides our residents with higher quality food, more attractive and tasteful dishes, and well-balanced meals with specialty desserts. We have added warm soups to the menus every lunch and dinner as well as more squash dishes, sweet potatoes, and winter vegetables.
